Section 1 - In Hand:

- Class 1: RoR/Riding Horse
- Class 2: Cob
- Class 3: Mountain and Moorland
- Class 4: Coloured
- Class 5: Child handler 14yrs and under
- Class 6: Veterans 15yrs and above (age of horse to be clearly displayed)
- Class 7: Ring championship

Section 2 - Ridden:

- Class 8: Best turned out
- Class 9: Junior Ridden 12 yrs. and under (if entries allow this class will split to lead rein and non lead reinsections)
- Class 10: Ridden RoR
- Class 11: Ridden Cob
- Class 12: Ridden Mountain and Moorland
- Class 13: Ridden Coloured
- Class 14: Riding Club Horse/pony (inc. small jump)
- Class 15: Ridden veteran 15yrs and above (age of horse to be clearly displayed)
- Class 16: Pony the judge would most like to take home
(Special for this class only - here will be a special prize for the prettiest mare/handsome gelding)
- Class 17: Ring Champion

START TIMES

Timings: In hand will start at 0900, Ridden will not start before 1200

Numbers will be available from the secretary on arrival.

ROSETTES

Rosettes will be awarded to 6th place in each class.

All 1st placed competitors in each section will qualify for the ring championship, a ring champion and reserve rosettes will be awarded, the Champion will also receive a sash and trophy

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

The competitions will be run under British Riding Club rules for 2024

Everyone mounted, whether competitor or not, shall wear a hard hat to at least the minimum standard, with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination. Hats must be the minimum standard allowed (See handbook for details). Skullcap hats must be worn with a silk.

It is advised that hair should be neatly secured and should not hang lower than the shoulder line when standing normally. Any item of jewellery or alternative medical treatment wrist band should be covered up by clothing or gloves, if they cannot be removed, will be worn as the rider's own risk.

Gloves are optional, and a body protector is recommended for show jumping.

A horse or pony may compete from 1 Jan in the year that it becomes 4 years old.

Only competitors may work in their Horse/pony prior to a class or phase

The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event, alter classes, times or any other published information. In the event of cancellation all fees will be refunded less 15%

Unless explicitly stated to the contrary, medical facilities on the showground will be limited to standard NHS accident and emergency callout
